The Annual SummerFest@Central Harbourfront Returns

Regular Programme BAMBOOSCAPE Co-organized with Hong Kong Architecture Centre Around 25 Outdoor Activities Including Arts, Music, Dance & Sports



May 30 - August 3 with Free Entry

Hong Kong, May 22, 2025 ...In addition to long being the world-renowned, iconic construction support material in Hong Kong, bamboo scaffolding has also recently been recognized as a local art form by the architecture sector as well as local residents and tourists. Given such a marvellous tribute, this year's **SummerFest@Central Harbourfront** is proud to present its regular program - **BAMBOOSCAPE**, showcasing Hong Kong's unique cultural treasures and urban landscape. In addition, a series of nearly 25 special pop-up activities centered on culture, music, dance, and sports will take place at the Central Harbourfront Event Space, making this summer even more exciting than ever before.

Organized by Central Venue Management (CVM), which exclusively operates and manages the Central Harbourfront Event Space, **SummerFest** kicks off its ninth season from May 30 to August 3, a total of 66 consecutive days at this core venue. All programs are available with free entry and are expected to attract tens of thousands of visitors. For many years, CVM has invited a wide range of art and cultural organizations to co-host various **SummerFest** programmes, providing new inspiration and engaging experiences for all attendees.

This year's regular programme - **BAMBOOSCAPE**, co-organized by the Hong Kong Architecture Centre and CVM, will feature several architectural masters and creative teams that have specially designed and constructed five large, fascinating bamboo art installations. Designers include: Assistant Professor



Philip Fung and Voraphope Prasertsap from Department of Architecture, Tunghai University; Dr. Tony Ip, a sustainable design architect and urban designer; HOUR 25, a team of four Hong Kong architects; Professor Hiroyuki Shinohara and his team from the Craft Design Research Lab @ CUHK Architecture; and two fibre artists, Cecilia Lai and Barnard Chan from Breakthrough Art Studio. The Hong Kong Architecture Centre has also invited experienced local bamboo craftsmen to take part in the construction, showcasing the unique techniques and cultural heritage of Hong Kong's traditional bamboo scaffolding craft.

A diverse line-up of special pop-up programs will also be presented on weekends, public holidays, and other designated days, covering four main areas: sports, music, dance, and culture. Highlights include the energetic Hong Kong Children's Balance Bike Group Championship, Central and Western District **3v3 Dodgeball Competition**, Baseball5 & eBASEBALL For All Day, plus Hong Kong Baseball5 Competition as well as Bicycle Circuit and Point Race. Attendees can enjoy all the thrilling competitions while also sharing in the joy of sweating it out together.

A host of special musical programs designed to inject rhythm into the bustling Central business district will include: CHAMpionTeng1 Hong Kong Youth Singing Competition, SingingShow, Next Star Singing Competition, Summer Vibes, My Rhythm Playground series, Neighbour Music Festival, and Let's Play Hong Kong! series. From pop bands and brass bands, locals and tourists alike can immerse themselves in a wonderful world of melodies and harmonies. Dance programmes will include Showcase Competition and Fiesta de Ballet, combining pure artistic exuberance and elegance. Cultural programs as well will include WanderFest Festival series, The Tao of Enjoyce series, Mermazing Summer Splash series, and Sri Lankans Talent Show, providing visitors with a multitude of colorful cultural experiences.

Large-scale Art Installations of BAMBOOSCAPE

《Waving Bamboo Pavilion》

Team: Philip Fung & Voraphope Prasertsap from Tunghai University

The bamboo scaffolding is commonly used in Hong Kong, which makes the hyper dense city lively and energetic. The design tries to use the scaffolding from being a building's surface to become a bamboo forest space for people to wander in. Through the soft rope roof, visitors may enjoy the unique city skyline of Central.

《The Wind Rose: Bamboo Ripples》

Team: Ar. Dr. Tony Ip

Made with recycled bamboo, this 3-meter high installation transforms the meteorological "wind rose diagram," a scientific chart that presents the distribution and speed of wind direction, into a touchable and accessible spatial narrative. As visitors move through the bamboo-walled passages, they capture the physical imprints of the wind, as if playing hide and seek with the city's microclimates. The so-called wind rose is nothing but a resilient trace of nature breathing amidst the concrete jungle.

《Whispers of the Wind》

Team: Breakthrough Arts

Themed with the imagining of the wind, the art installation integrates elements such as kites, windmills, and wind chimes, providing audiences with both visual and auditory experiences. The shadow of the bamboo woven pattern will interact with the sunlight over time. Blessing is always hidden in the traditional weaving. Kite means rising, and the bamboo woven floral pattern means full of vigour. The rotary of windmills also means good luck.

《Sushi Stool》

Team: HOUR 25

Sushi Stool is a portable, lightweight urban furniture. Presented on a large-scale bamboo rolling mat crafted by a local bamboo master, rolls of Sushi Stool invite visitors to become ad-hoc sushi Senseis, selecting their own "fillings" for the Sushi Stools and transforming the Central harbourfront into a vibrant social gathering platter.

《Pause. Weave. Move》

Team: Craft Design Research Lab @CUHK Architecture

Woven by traditional bamboo techniques, this installation reconciles the shifting rhythms of nature with the silent tension of the soaring skyscrapers in the heart of a bustling metropolis. The canopy's porous and organic form allows light and wind to pass through. It sways gently, caressed by the bay's breeze,



its rhythm synchronizing with the rippling surface of the water, creating ever-shifting patterns of shadow on the ground. At its core, an oculus rises gracefully, connecting earth and sky. It halts the hurried steps of passers-by, offering a fleeting moment of stillness — a quiet awakening to nature's presence, a reminder of our connection to the natural world.
